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5	23	New paragraph 9.7a	As noted by WSCC Highways in relation to highway safety, the scheme has been the subject of an independent Stage 1 Road Safety Audit which identifies any road safety-related concerns with the preliminary design. The road safety audit process would continue, if permission is granted, with a stage 2 audit required of the detailed design, a stage 3 audit on completion of construction, and a stage 4 monitoring audit required to identify road safety matters and remedial actions, taking into account 12 months of road collision data. WSCC Highways also confirms that the road has been designed to minimise the risk and severity of accidents. The scheme is not, therefore, considered to have an unacceptable impact on highway safety. 5	25	New paragraph 9.35a	The northern extent of the bypass would pass through the edge of Brookfield historic parkscape which surrounds Brookfield House, a Listed Building, and a number of trees on the property would be removed. However, it is not considered this would affect the setting of the Listed Building because of the thick, mature vegetation and buildings between it and the proposed road. The vegetation lost would be at the southern edge of the parkscape, and adjacent to the existing road, so it is not considered it would have significant impact on it. 6	63	9.43	It is proposed that a Section 106 Routing Agreement would be imposed on the HGVs	

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			associated with the infilling operations, ensuring these HGVs are directed east towards the A24 thereby ensuring no additional HGVs would travel north along Water Lane or through the centre of Storrington, avoiding the Air Quality Management Area (AQMA). The applicant has agreed to such a legal agreement. To ensure enforceability of HGV movements and monitor alleged breaches, the applicant has agreed to install an Automatic Number Plate Recognition System (or similar) to establish whether a purported HGV is associated with the sand extraction operations or that of infilling activities.
