

## Decision correction

### Education and Skills

#### **Allocation of funding for new school at Thorney Island Primary School**

In June 2020 the Cabinet Member for Education and Skills took a decision to approve the allocation of funding from the Basic Need Capital Programme to enable the provision of a new school hall at Thorney Island Primary School (decision [ES1\(20/21\)](#) refers). The basic need allocation required for the project of £857,000 was correctly recorded in the financial section of the report. A typographical error meant the incorrect figure of £817,000 was included in the recommendation.

The correct recommendations in relation to this decision are detailed below and the published decision details and decision report in the link above have been corrected to reflect this:

The Cabinet Member for Education and Skills has approved:

1. The allocation of £857,000 from the Basic Need Capital Programme to complete the design services, and to fund the expansion works and the completion of a procurement process for the delivery of works at Thorney Island Primary School as detailed in paragraphs 2.1, 4.2 and 4.3 of the report; and
2. That subject to Ministry of Defence consent recorded by a licence for alterations and possibly a development agreement if required, the delegation of authority to award and enter into the contract for carrying out the works detailed in the report to the Director of Property and Assets.

## Decisions confirmed following call-in

The following decisions have been confirmed in the last week following the call-in process

### **Emergency Active Travel Fund Cycle Lane - A286 Chichester ring-road HI10(20/21)**

In response to the recommendation of the Environment and Communities Scrutiny Committee at its [meeting on 18 November](#), the Cabinet Member for Highways and Infrastructure has confirmed his decision. The Scrutiny Committee rejected the call-in but requested that the Cabinet Member considers the closeness of the vote before confirming his decision.
