

Forward Plan of Key Decisions

The County Council must give at least 28 days' notice of all key decisions to be taken by councillors or officers. The Plan describes these proposals and the month in which the decisions are to be taken over a four-month period. Decisions are categorised according to <u>Cabinet Member</u> portfolios.

The most important decisions will be taken by the Cabinet sitting in public. The meetings are also available to watch online via our <u>webcasting website</u>. The <u>schedule of monthly Cabinet meetings</u> is available on the website.

The Forward Plan is updated regularly and key decisions can be taken on any day in the month if they are not taken at Cabinet meetings. The <u>Plan</u> is available on the website. <u>Published decisions</u> are also available via the website.

Procurement of Single Supplier Framework for delivery of Solar PV and Battery Storage Programme

Following a market engagement exercise and technical and structural feasibility surveys, 84 sites; 23 corporate and 61 school sites, have been identified as suitable to-date for having roof-top Solar Photovoltaic (PV) technology installed and 68 of these sites (to-date) will also include a Battery Storage system.

The programme will be funded from an approved allocation of £7.7m in the capital programme and will support the council's commitment to achieving Net Zero emissions from its operations by 2030 (as set out in the council's Climate Change Strategy 2020-2030). It will also help meet the agreed priorities in the council's recently adopted <u>2030</u> Energy Strategy by reducing grid electricity consumption, increasing renewable energy

generation in the county, and reducing carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions. In addition to electricity cost savings for the County Council, schools will also benefit from a reduction in electricity costs.

The procurement process will allow for further phases of solar PV and battery storage to be fitted to the county council's buildings and the county's schools (subject to the authority to do so being granted and internal capacity to support delivery by the supplier). It will also seek to appoint a Demand Side Response (DSR) provider to manage the charged status and market value from the battery storage installations.

The Cabinet Member for Environment and Climate Change will be asked to approve the procurement process and delegate authority to the Assistant Director (Environment and Public Protection) to award the contracts.

Contract award for performance monitoring, operation and maintenance of ground mounted solar PV systems

Since 2014, West Sussex County Council has installed ground-mounted solar power systems at both Tangmere and Westhampnett with a total capacity of 12.44 MW.

The performance of these systems will be optimised through operational monitoring alongside planned and reactive maintenance in order to -

- maximise renewable energy generated to substitute for carbon emitting sources
- derive energy savings for the council
- protect the County Council's investment in these systems

A tender process will be started in July 2022 with a view to securing best value for the provision of the services.

The Assistant Director (Environment and Public Protection) will be asked to award the contract for the monitoring, operation and maintenance of ground-mounted solar PV systems owned by West Sussex County Council, in accordance with the Council's Standing Orders on Procurement and Contracts.

Review of Integrated Parking Strategy 2022 - 2027

As the Highway Authority for West Sussex, the County Council has an Integrated Parking Strategy (IPS) that sets out its approach to managing parking. This mainly includes the management and enforcement of parking controls and regulations on the public highway, often referred to as 'on-street', but it also sets out its view and role in offstreet parking provision, primarily provided by the six District and Borough Councils in West Sussex. The IPS also sets out how the County Council's approach to parking management relates to its other policies and strategies.

The West Sussex IPS was last updated in 2014 and this latest review, covering the period from 2022 to 2027, seeks to ensure that the County Council's approach to managing parking remains appropriate and effective at meeting the needs of local communities as well as its other objectives.

The Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport will be asked to approve the revised Integrated Parking Strategy.

Response to the consultation by Transport for the South East on a Draft Strategic Investment Plan

Transport for the South East (TfSE) is the sub-national transport body, currently operating in shadow form, that covers Berkshire, East Sussex, Hampshire, Kent, Surrey, and West Sussex. It has the twin purposes of facilitating the delivery of a regional transport strategy and promoting economic growth in the South East.

In 2020, TfSE approved a <u>Transport Strategy for the South East</u>, which aims to shape the South East as a region economically, technologically and environmentally over the next 30 years, and change the way that investment is made in transport. TfSE has subsequently prepared two thematic strategies (on Future Mobility and Freight, Logistics and Gateways) and five area studies covering all parts of the region. The area studies have identified and appraised potential strategic transport interventions (i.e. rail, highways, mass transit and active travel) that have been included in packages of interventions. As the area studies are strategic, they do not cover every local issue as there are other programmes for this, including the County Council's own investment programmes.

This technical work has informed the development of a <u>Draft Strategic Investment Plan</u> (SIP) setting out a series of investment opportunities for Government, Local Transport Authorities and transport providers to consider investing in. Once finalised, the SIP will inform future decision-making by the County Council and other key stakeholders.

The Draft SIP is published for consultation with constituent authorities, including the County Council, and wider stakeholders between June and September 2022.

A259 Littlehampton Corridor Improvements - additional funding allocation

The A259 Littlehampton Corridor improvement scheme is currently under construction. It comprises dualling the existing single carriageway between the new Fitzalan Link Road (east of the Wick Roundabout) and the Body Shop Roundabout as well as between the Station Road Roundabout and A280 Roundabout. Additionally, new cycling and pedestrian facilities are being provided adjacent to but separated from the carriageway.

A <u>decision</u> was taken by the Cabinet Member for Highways and Infrastructure in July 2019 to award the build phase contract, agree the Target Price and approve funding sources.

The Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport will be asked to approve an additional capital allocation for the improvement scheme following higher than forecast levels of inflation.

Highways and Transport Delivery Programme 2023-2024

The Highway and Transport Delivery Programmes identify capital highways infrastructure maintenance and transport improvement schemes for delivery during 2023/24 and beyond. Capital funding for the Delivery Programmes is predominantly received from the Government for roads maintenance (the Local Highway Maintenance Block), and transport improvements (the Integrated Transport Block) supported by additional funding from developer agreements and contributions.

The indicative forward programmes for Highway Infrastructure Maintenance, Local Transport Improvements (LTIP) and Community Highway Schemes (CHS), have informed the 2023/24 Highways and Transport Delivery Programmes. These provide transparency of the maintenance and improvement investment needs and the funding priorities prepared and selected for review and approval in this decision.

The Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport will be asked to approve -

- 1. the Highway and Transport Delivery Programmes 2023-24; and
- 2. delegate authority to the Assistant Director (Highways, Transport and Planning) to adjust the 2023/24 Delivery Programmes to take account of budgetary pressures and any changes in priority arising as a result of network availability, emergencies or other operational circumstances, in consultation with the Cabinet Member.

It should be noted that the above will be subject to confirmation of funding at a Full Council meeting.
