- (c) The number of children living in West Sussex receiving care from CAMHS for an eating disorder.
- (d) The number of children on the waiting list to receive CAMHS care for an eating disorder.

Please provide this by appropriate age group (for example under 11, 11-15, 16-18)

(e) In addition, please can the Cabinet Member confirm the amount and scope of County Council investment in support within school or elsewhere for eating disorders (encompassing both clinical diagnoses and eating issues otherwise raising concern) over the last five years.
